14th annual Awbrey Park Wildflower Celebration

took place on Saturday, May 3rd, 2025, from 11 am to 2 pm at Awbrey Park in Eugene, Oregon.

The free, family-friendly event celebrated the park's native wildflowers, shrubs, and trees. Attendees participated in guided nature walks or explored at their own pace with a self-guided tour. A popular activity was the treasure hunt, where finding a certain number of identified plants earned participants a native plant to take home.

New to this year's celebration was a bird walk led by Katie McMinnis from the Cascade Raptor Center. Other activities included live music from local Santa Clara musicians, rock painting, kids' games, and learning about certifying backyards as pollinator-friendly.

Food trucks were also present, offering tacos and ice cream. Several local organizations had booths to share information, including the Lane County Master Gardeners Mobile Plant Clinic, Lane County Audubon Society, Boy Scout Troop 182, and the River Road - Santa Clara Voluntary Library.

The event aimed to foster appreciation for the local flora, fauna, and community connections and was sponsored by the City of Eugene's Parks and Open Space, the Santa Clara Community Organization, and the Friends of Awbrey Park.



Join the Friends of Awbrey Park for their 18th Season

The Friends of Awbrey Park formed during the winter of 2008-2009. Over the past 17 years the Friends have made incredible improvements to the park. Friends removed blackberries and invasive ivy along Spring Creek, they planted over 300 native plants, shrubs, and trees during the 2010-2011 season. Recent projects include installation of a sturdy kiosk (added as part of an Eagle Scout project), planting and upkeep of a Pollinator garden, basalt benches, and a bridge over Spring Creek at the back of the park.

Most importantly, the Friends work to restore the parks native habitat. Please consider joining Awbrey Park volunteer leaders Jesika Heikkinen and Gary Haliski, along with the rest of the group, starting in October. Projects include trail maintenance, planting, and blackberry and ivy removal. We have had a vicious invasive attack our Pollinator garden, so if you have special skills in working in Pollinator gardens, please drop by. **Work parties are from 9 am until noon, on the first Saturday of the month, October through April,** and will be followed by the 15th Annual Wildflower Celebration in early May. Tools, snacks, and beverages are provided.

A LEGACY PROJECT FOR SANTA CLARA

SUPPORT SANTA CLARA SCHOOLHOUSE PROJECT TODAY

At Santa Clara Community Foundation, we believe that preserving our shared history is a powerful way to honor the past and inspire future generations. That's why we're launching a vital restoration project to save and revitalize the Lower Santa Clara School. This project isn't just about bricks and mortar — it's about community, identity, and legacy.

The Lower Santa Clara schoolhouse on River Loop 2 is where we have set our sights. Picture a lovingly restored building available for community use. Summer concerts that spill out into our community park, adult classes, meeting space, a venue for reunions and celebrations, a location for summer day camps for our neighborhood children, a nexus for emergency preparedness. This project will allow our community to host more events, build deeper relationships, and foster greater neighborhood resilience into the future.

The idea is simple; build community around a community center. The project is complex; a community owned resource on Santa Clara Community Park land restored with the goodwill, dedication, ingenuity, and generosity of neighbors. That's where you come in. We are actively fundraising \$250,000 for the project.

Built in 1901, time has taken its toll on the Lower Santa Clara Schoolhouse. The structure now faces critical deterioration, and without urgent intervention, we risk losing it forever.

Our restoration plan includes:

- Structural stabilization
- Preservation of original architectural features
- Environmental updates for accessibility and sustainability
- Community programming and educational outreach

WHY SHOULD I DONATE TO THIS PROJECT WHEN THERE IS SO MUCH NEED ALL AROUND ME?

With national economic uncertainty, global climate crisis, and wars being waged worldwide, it is easy to feel overwhelmed. Resilience, in all its forms, is the antidote to that situation and community relationships are how we get there. A place where we build those relationships is the missing ingredient.
