Join Us in Bringing the Santa Clara Schoolhouse Back to Life

Built in 1901, the Santa Clara Schoolhouse is a treasured neighborhood landmark that once served as a place of learning, gathering, and shared community life. Today, the Santa Clara Community Foundation invites neighbors, friends, and supporters to help restore this historic building and transform it into a vibrant, inclusive community center for generations to come.

The Schoolhouse Project is a community-powered effort to preserve our past while investing in our future. Once restored, the schoolhouse will host classes, meetings, events, celebrations, and everyday moments that strengthen neighborhood connections.

A Clear Vision with Measurable Impact

Our fundraising goal is \$250,000 over 18–24 months, beginning with a Phase 1 goal of \$100,000 to stabilize and restore the building. The project is organized into transparent, fundable phases so donors can see progress at every step:

- **Phase 1: Reconstruction & Restoration (\$100,000 | Months 1–12)** Roof, foundation, walls, windows, siding, doors, and exterior paint.
- **Phase 2: Core Systems Upgrade (\$50,000 | Months 12–18)** Plumbing, electrical, HVAC, and ADA accessibility improvements.
- **Phase 3: Interior Fit-Out (\$50,000 | Months 18–24)** Floors, walls, restrooms, kitchen, lighting, and interior finishes.
- **Phase 4: Site & Community Activation (\$25,000 | Months 18–24)** Landscaping, signage, furnishings, and community launch activities.

Contingency (\$25,000) Reserved for unforeseen needs to protect the project and donor investment.

Powered by the Community

Fundraising will run alongside construction through grants, community outreach, crowdfunding, and local events. A public fundraising tracker will share progress and keep everyone connected to the journey.

Our message is simple:

- Preserve a historic neighborhood treasure
- Create a practical, welcoming community hub

Build a lasting, self-sustaining resource for Santa Clara

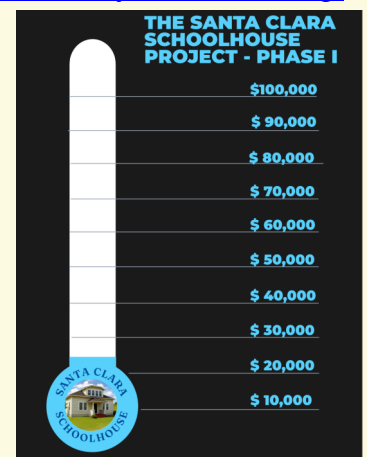

15th Awbrey Park Wildflower Celebration May 2, 2026

The 15th annual Awbrey Park Wildflower Celebration will be on May 2nd, from 11 am until 2 pm.

There will be two guided tours as well as the opportunity to take a self-guided tour. Discover native flowers, shrubs, and trees. The Friends of Awbrey Park will be stationed throughout the park to help you find trillium, lupine, red Columbine, bleeding heart, violets, fairy bells, false Solomon's Seal, Oregon myrtle, and much, much more. Other items to look forward to:

- The very popular Treasure Hunt – Search for native plants and earn a native plant while supplies last. Plants are provided by the City of Eugene.
- Live Music from Santa Clara musicians
- Rock Painting – Rocks and paint provided. You make up your design.
- Kids games on the lawn plus three play areas for toddlers through age 12
- Horseshoes
- Food Trucks

- Boy Scout Troop 182 – Thank the young men who have helped chip our trails for many years and been responsible for the flourishing natives on 'Boy Scout Bank'
- CERT, Eugene EMCOMM, and Ready Northwest will be at the event to give important information about Community Emergency Response and Emergency Communication.
- Learn about the River Road Santa Clara Volunteer Library. They have over 13,000 items, including fiction and nonfiction for adults and children, audiobooks, and DVDs.
- Meet the Friends of Awbrey Park. The Friends just completed their 18th year of restoring and maintaining the park.

Bring a picnic. Children are more than welcome. The park features three playground areas. One for 2-5 years old and two for 6-12 years. There is also a large playfield, a pollinator garden, Spring Creek and a small forest where you will find woodpeckers, mallards, newts, and salamanders.

This holiday season, **SCCO** and **St. Matthew's Episcopal Church** partnered to host two incredible events—the **Thanksgiving Food Drive** and the **Neighbors Helping Neighbors Food Drive and Coffee Hour**—and the impact was truly heartwarming.

Thanksgiving Food Drive: Together, we provided holiday meals to families in need. **St. Matthew's Episcopal Church** generously supplied **12 turkeys**, while **SCCO** contributed all the fixings for **12 complete holiday meals**, along with **gift cards for perishables**. Thanks to your generosity, we raised **\$1,073** to support this effort. A special thank you to **Grocery Outlet on River Rd.** for donating **reusable bags** to help transport food to families.

Neighbors Helping Neighbors Food Drive and Coffee Hour (December 17): Thanks to your generosity, we raised **nearly \$1,800** and supported **20 families**, helping them bridge the Christmas holiday break with essential meals. Our mission is simple yet powerful: to provide safe, stable, and supportive transitional housing for individuals in the Eugene/Springfield area seeking a fresh start. Through a two-year rent-free program, personalized case management, and community connection, we help residents build income stability, secure permanent housing, and improve overall well-being.



In 2022, what began as an idea right here in Santa Clara, has grown into a thriving program with three cottages, volunteer support, and partnerships that empower neighbors to transition from homelessness to permanent housing.
